



## Furepe Waterfall Trail



Round-trip approx. 2 km summer 40 minutes winter 1 hour Free

A trail that condenses the nature of Shiretoko. After walking through a forest and grassland, the Observation Deck provides views of the Sea of Okhotsk and the Furepe Waterfall cascading down the cliff.

## Forest Keeper Trail / Deer Fence Course



Round-trip approx. 1 km 30 minutes

Free (Summer only)

This course takes you into an enclosure set up to prevent deer from foraging on and damaging newly planted trees. You can see replanting efforts being carried out to restore the area's diversity.

#### Forest Keeper Trail / Pioneer Course



Round-trip approx. 5 km summer 2 hours winter 3 hours Free

A long trail through an area that was once farmland for pioneers. Currently, forest restoration activities are being carried out as part of the "Shiretoko 100 Square-Meter Movement."

#### Shiretoko 100 Square-Meter Movement Trust House



A key piece of Shiretoko's unique history. This facility introduces the "Shiretoko 100 Square-Meter Movement," which was the first nature-preservation "land trust" movement in Japan,
